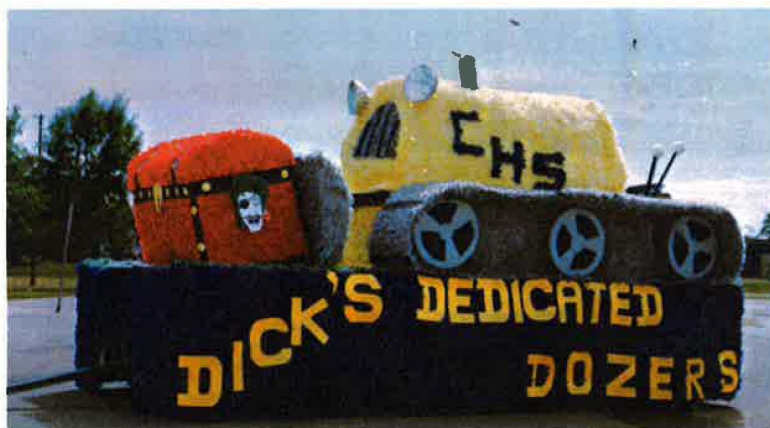
The C-Club sponsored the annual Homecoming dance. Live entertainment, the Sam Ease Band, provided a fantastic end to the festive week.

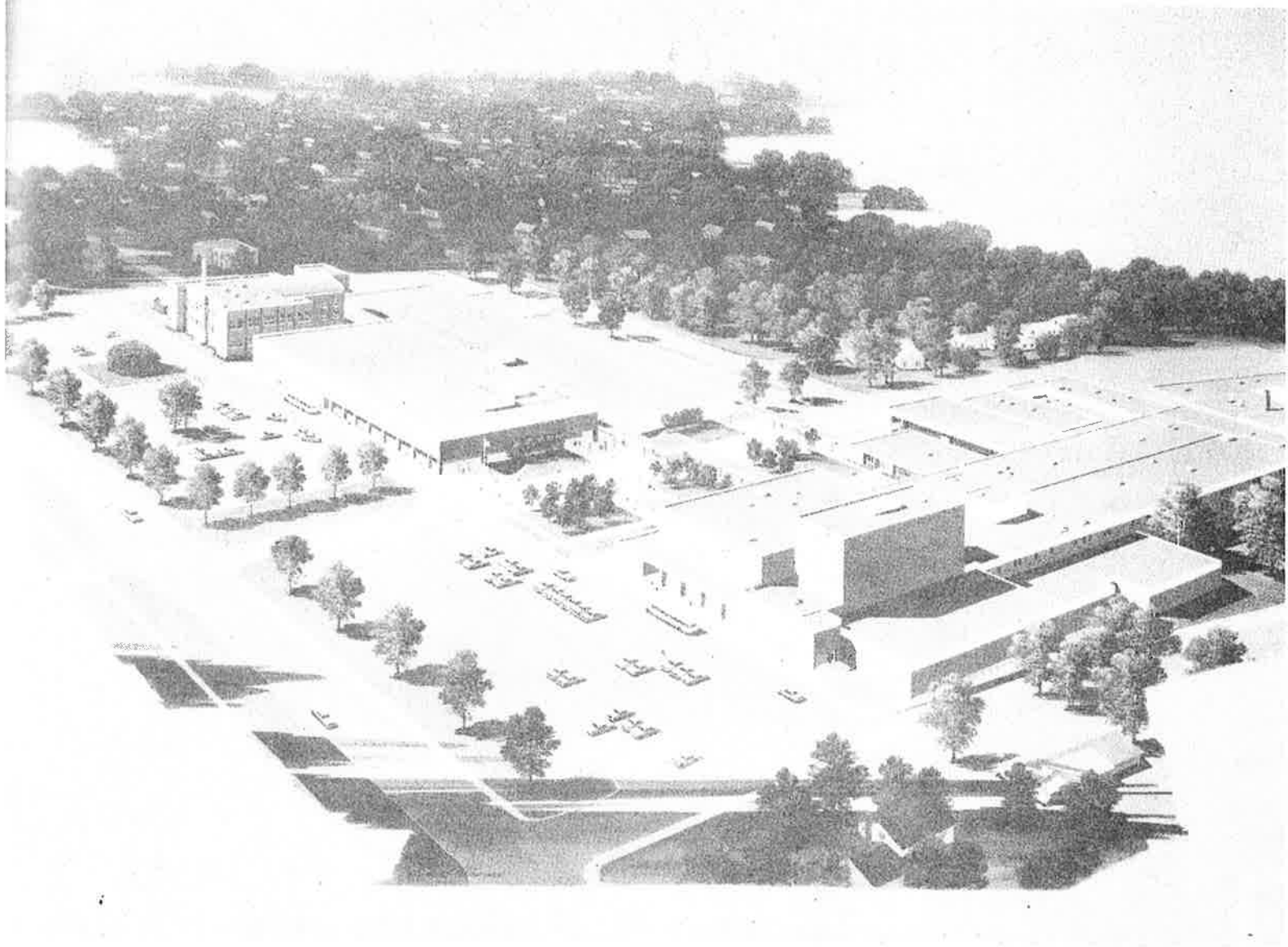

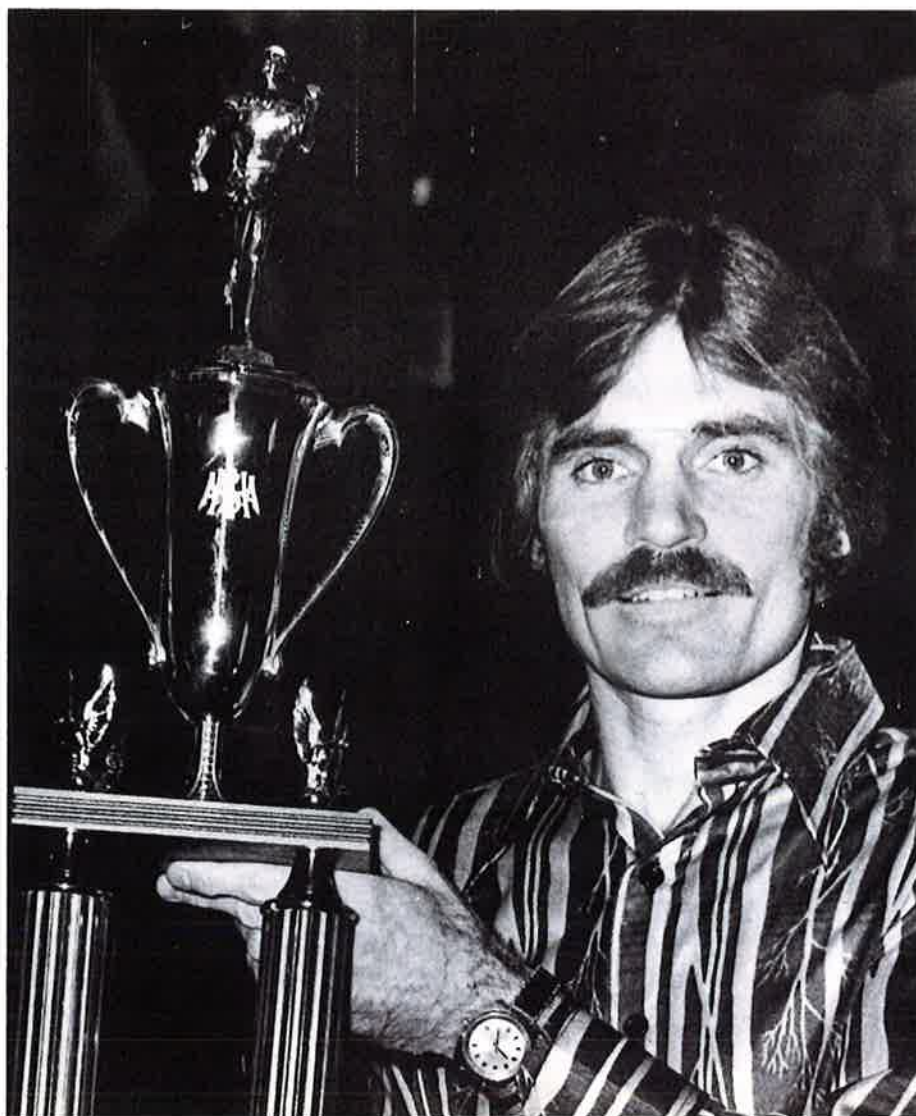

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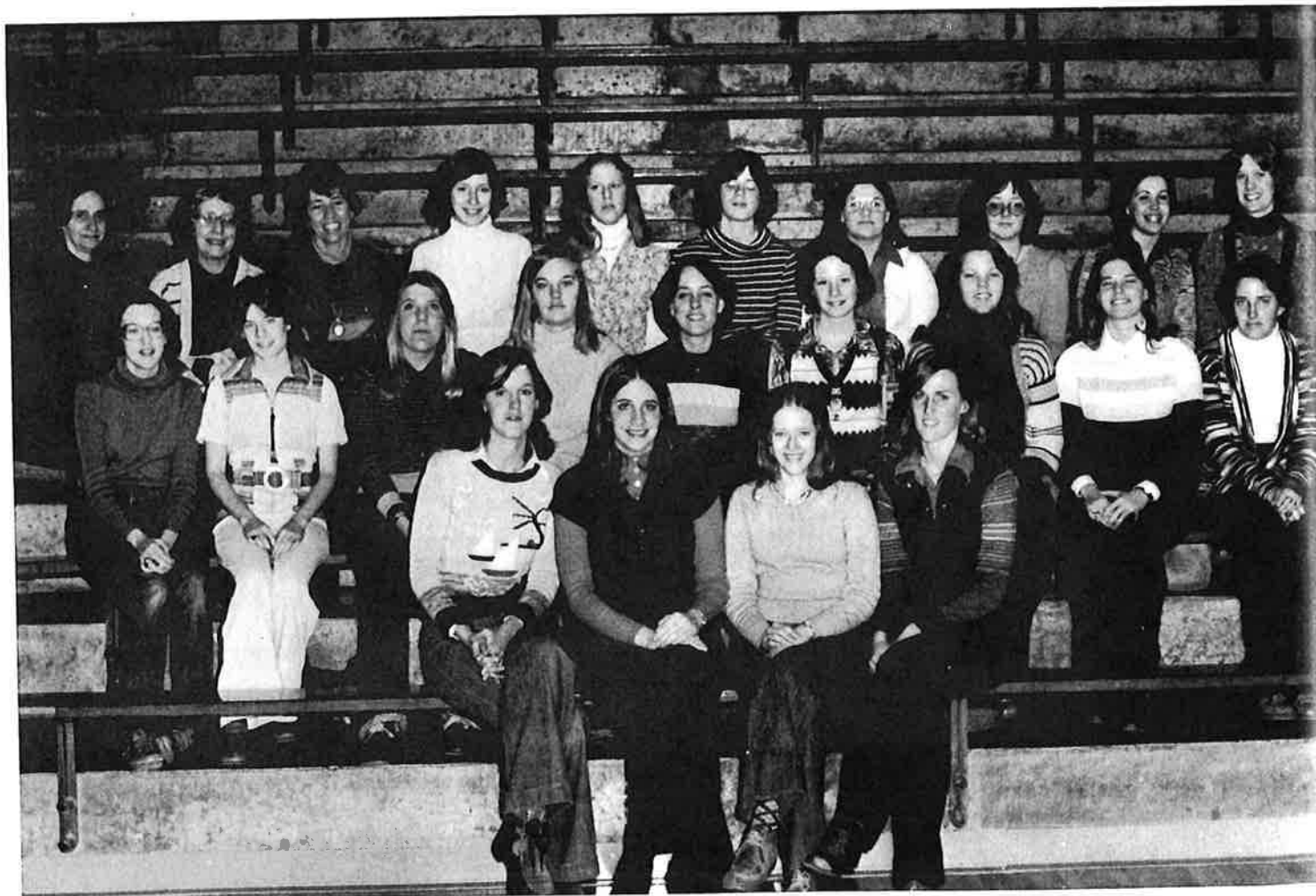
HOME EC AND IND. ARTS TEACH CRAFTSMANSHIP

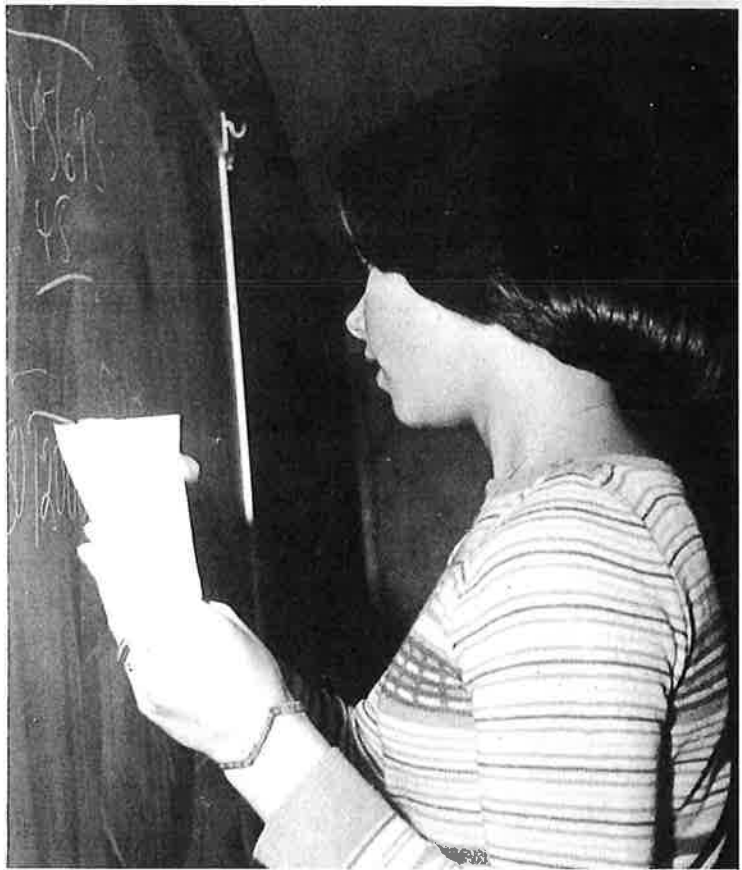

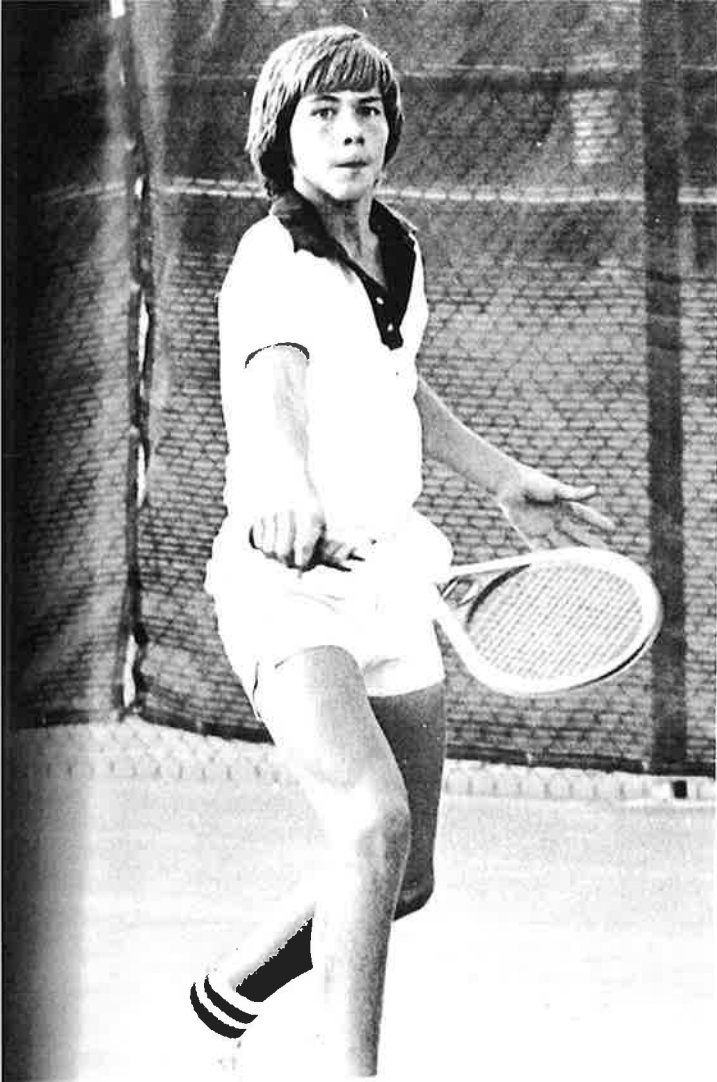

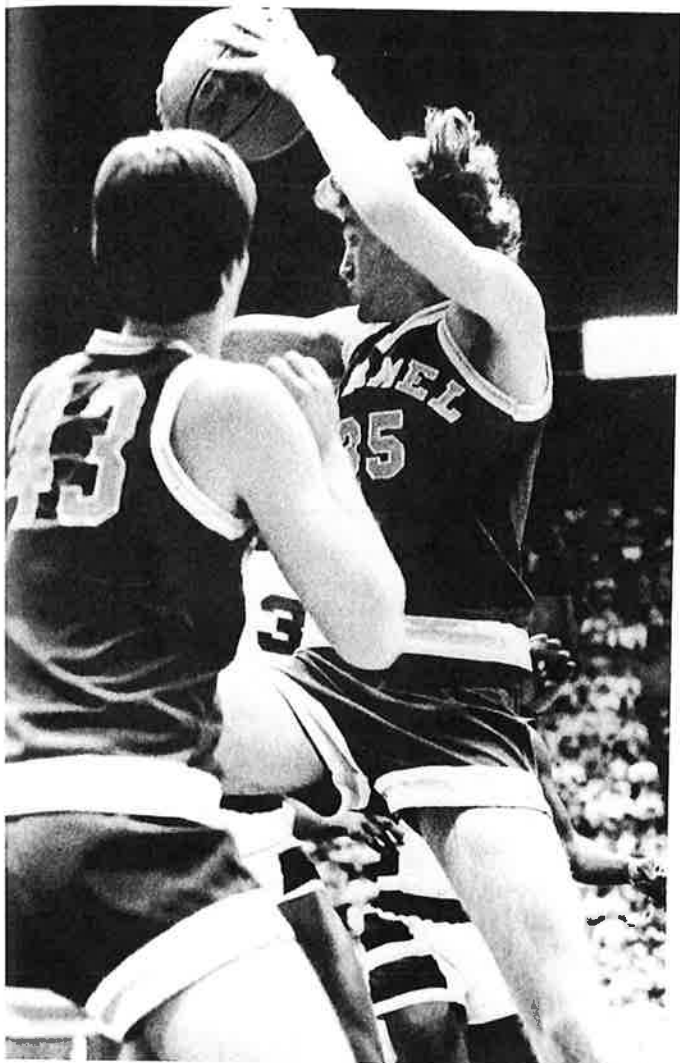

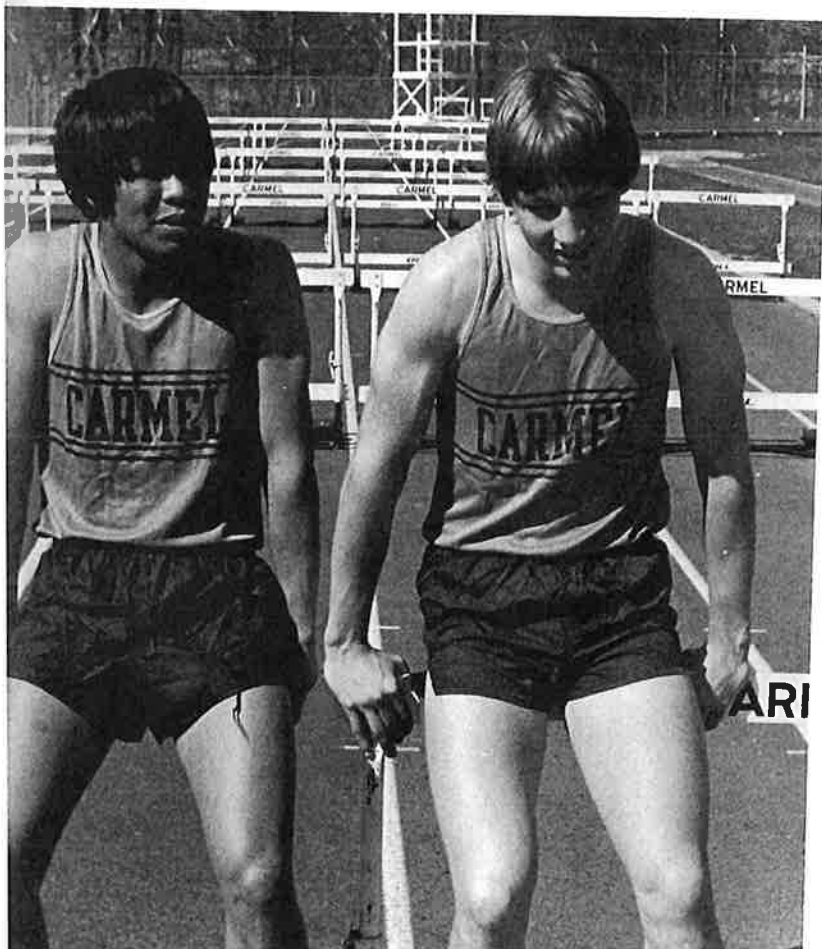

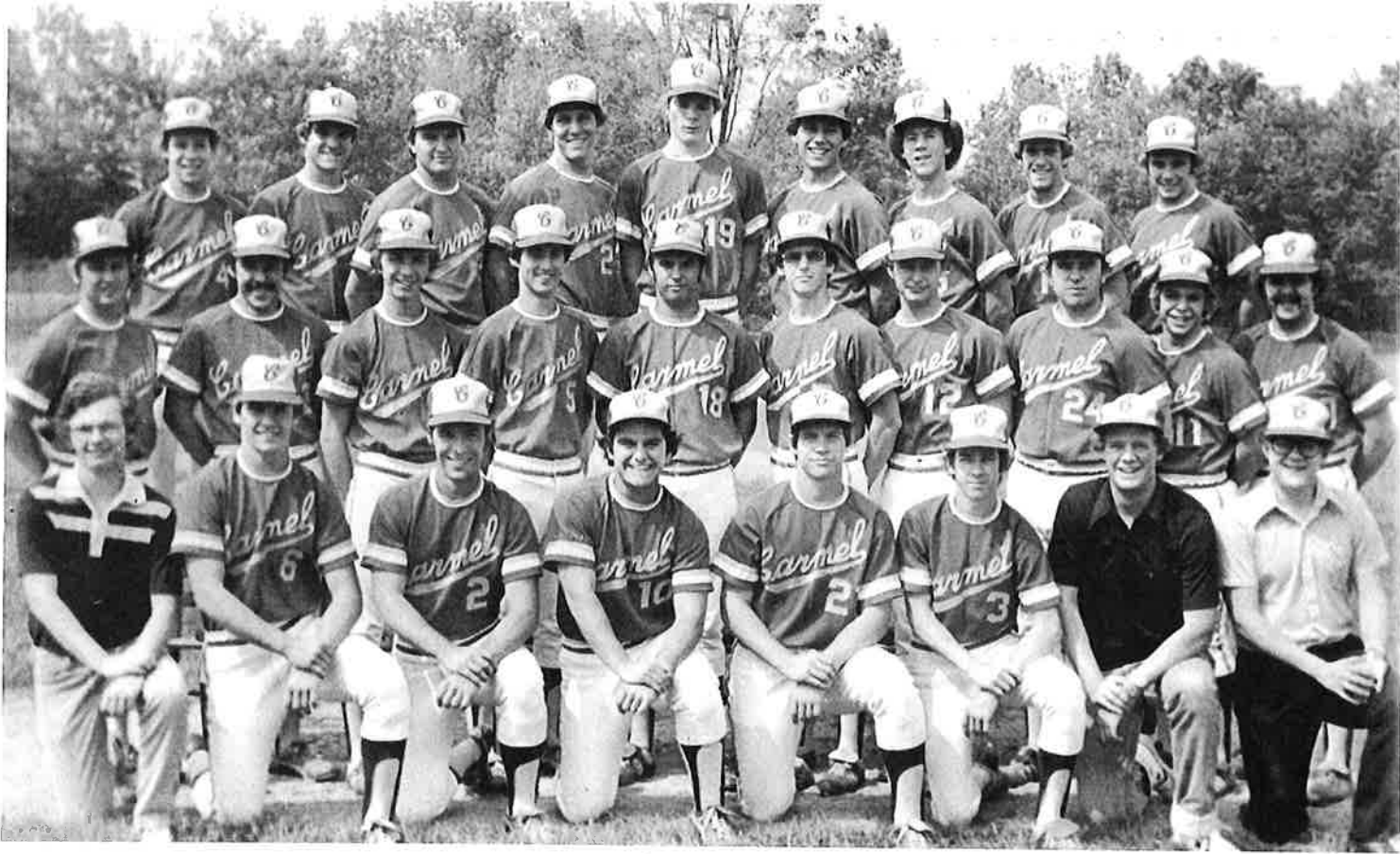

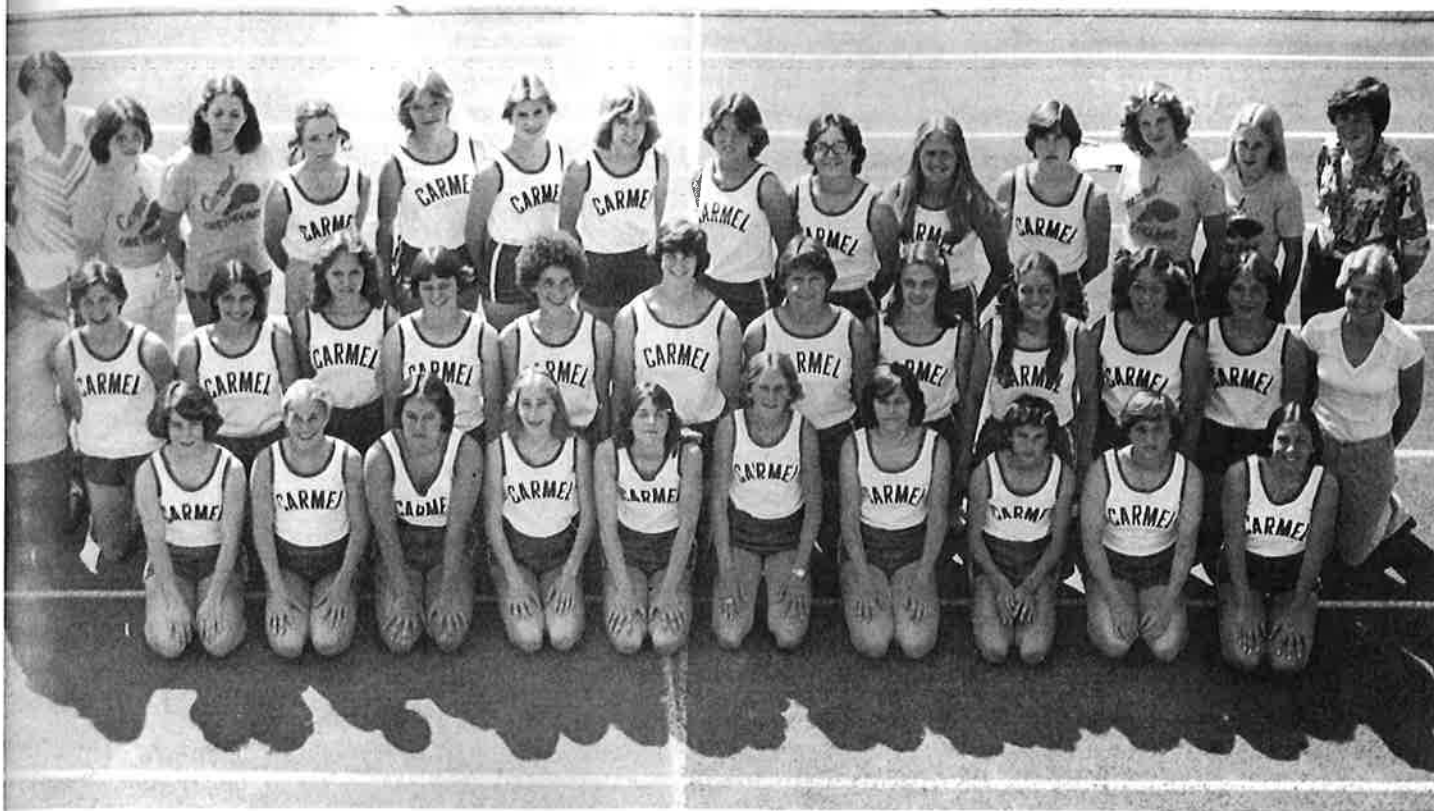
